In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food & Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit Nevada County's 2005 Annual Crop Report.

The total value of Nevada County's 2005 agricultural crop production was \$18,121,200. This crop value in 2005 increased by \$683,300 from the 2004 Annual Crop Report. The Wine Grape industry had the largest decrease in value of \$505,200. Bearing acreage for Wine Grapes has continued to change with some producing acreage coming out of production while some newer vineyards are coming into production. Apples, cherries and peaches were hit with a late freeze. The Timber industry had a increase of \$32,700 due to a 9% increase in the number of board feet cut.

All figures represent gross production values and do not take into account the cost of production and do not reflect a net return to the producers.

The preparation of this report requires extensive collaboration between many individuals and I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation of all growers, organizations and industry representatives who provided information necessary for this report. I would like to offer special recognition to John Mills, Agricultural Biologist III who is retiring after 33 years as an Agricultural Biologist and Joseph Damiano, Agricultural Biologist III who compiled this report.
