Marin has vital agricultural industries and food systems that are economically and environmentally sustainable and that provide diverse products to a community that values and actively supports local agriculture.

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Agricultural education is an integral part of the Marin school community from lessons and projects in classrooms, on farms and in school gardens to local foods in the school food service programs

Indicators that the Vision has been Accomplished

All Marinites will:

Know which agricultural products are grown in Marin and where to purchase them Support and work to preserve Marin farms as a source of fresh local foods Understand that eating fresh locally grown food is beneficial Appreciate the agricultural resources of Marin that contribute to open space & scenic beauty Be able to visit a farm

All Marin Students will:

Know where their food comes from and how it is grown Know that they depend on agriculture, and that agriculture depends on them Understand the interconnection among agriculture, people, and the environment Participate in an educational farm field trip

All Marin Farmers will:

Be able to sustain their operations economically and environmentally Have sufficient distribution and outlets for their products Have a streamlined and supportive county-permitting process that enhances their operations

Ways to Achieve the Vision

- 1. Educate Marin school children about agriculture in schools and on farms
- 2. Support and encourage the purchase of local food in schools, institutions, and retail stores
- 3. Build public awareness and understanding of the importance of supporting local agriculture by increasing media coverage and public agency understanding
- 4. Support viability of agriculture in Marin with pro-active public policy and planning
- 5. Provide interested ranchers and farmer with tools for sustaining and enhancing their operations
