This workshop will help greenhouse and nursery growers evaluate their water quality management practices and implement an IPM program. It will also help growers in Region 3 comply with ag waiver requirements for developing and updating their farm water quality plans by October 1. DPR and CCA CEUs requested; 4 ag waiver hours requested from the Los Angeles Regional Water Board for growers in Region 4.

Objectives: Help growers (1) conduct a self-audit of current water quality management practices, (2) develop a farm water quality plan, and (3) implement an IPM program to reduce impacts on water quality. Review irrigation, nutrient, and pesticide BMPs and sediment/erosion control for production and nonproduction areas in greenhouses and nurseries.
