

## Mill Creek Trailway - Fairway Plant List

## Northwest Corner Main Street & Fairway Drive along Mill Creek

Gardening "Central Valley Style" uses a sustainable garden that thrives naturally with a minimum input of water, fertilizer, pesticides, and labor and as such is environmentally friendly. When choosing plants for your garden be sure that they are adapted to our climate zone (Mediterranean climate - Sunset Zones 7 & 8) and are not invasive. Native plants are often better adapted to the environment than exotic plants providing important habitat for our native wildlife.

Even the most drought-tolerant plants require careful watering during their first year, and sometimes longer as they need time to establish root structure. So don't assume a plant is drought-tolerant until at least its second full season. This is especially true of any plant placed in the ground in the spring. Fall planting is usually best as it gives the plant more time to get established before experiencing the stress of a hot summer.
