The Hopland Research and Extension Center covers 5300 acres in the Mayacamas Mountains. The topography is steep, rising steadily to the NE from an elevation of 600' in the Russian River valley floor to 3000' at the top of the Center. The climate is Mediterranean, and precipitation averages more than 37" annually. There are a number of seasonal streams, vernal pools, stock ponds, and 2 large natural ponds. There are 4 principal vegetation types: grass, oak woodland-grass, dense oak woodland, and chaparral. This varied habitat supports an abundance and diversity of birds. We list here 219 species documented within the Center. We are grateful for all those who have shared their observations with us. In particular, we would like to acknowledge Bill Longhurst, Carl Koford, and Pete Sands who left extensive observation notes in the Center files.
